WEEKLY FAMILY UPDATE

Grand Traverse Pavilions update for residents and responsible parties during COVID-19

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In response to the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services all nursing homes in the state are mandated to test their staff and residents for COVID-19. The Pavilions weekly testing was completed on Monday, 1/11/20, with nearly 600 staff and residents tested.

As required, we are notifying residents, families and staff of any positive COVID test results. <u>All</u> individuals on the Pavilions work roster, whether the have worked recently or not, are on-call/part-time or full time, are required to be COVID-19 tested weekly (or bi-weekly per CMS).

As national, state and local COVID-19 infection rates start to decline, we are encouraged to also see a decline in the number of confirmed positive cases among our staff and residents. The recent reduction in the infection rate has allowed the Pavilions to resume weekly testing of staff and residents, the results this week are as follows:

Testing positive this week was one (1) Hawthorn resident who is without symptoms. They are being monitored and self-isolating.

Daily screening and hygiene practices for our staff are diligently being adhered to, and clinical leadership is continually reviewing and updating our infection control practices/policies to ensure every effort is being made to prevent the introduction and/or spread of COVID-19 in the Pavilions' facilities. We have added additional safety measures for our staff including mandatory wearing of KN95 masks and heavy duty goggles or shields.

We are closely monitoring the local positivity rate of COVID infection, which is currently at 9.9%. If this percentage exceeds 10% we will reinstitute the CMS requirement for skilled nursing facilities to test employees twice a week. Under the CMS guidelines residents are not required to be tested twice weekly.

The Pavilions has completed the first round of vaccination of residents and staff. Residents will receive their second dose 2/1 and 2/2. We will need a new consent for the second dose. Also new residents or those residents who did not receive their first dose at the January clinic are eligible to receive their first dose in February. Again, consent forms are required.

We are looking forward to the COVID-19 infection rates continuing to decline so we can welcome back our resident families and volunteers. Please continue to be diligent with your own personal efforts to stay healthy and safe.
