We have recently completed the installation of the ActivePure air purification system in the main building. This system was originally developed to be used on the international space station, and was later adapted to be used in public spaces, such as schools, hospitals and other healthcare facilities. This technology pulls ambient air in and converts the oxygen and humidity in the air into hydroxyl radicals, which will break down the outer shell of viruses, bacteria, and fungi, inactivating them. In addition to inactivating these pathogens in the air, the hydroxyl radicals also settle onto the surfaces in the room, inactivating the pathogens on any surfaces.

The system is installed in our ductwork, and is running continuously. There were approximately 92 units, installed in carefully engineered areas of the building to provide a grade 5 (hospital grade) solution.

We did some preliminary testing in the in the employee break room and childcare center between May and June 2022. Preliminary results showed a 50% reduction in bacteria, and a 60% reduction in fungus count on the surfaces, and a 66% reduction in bacteria and a 75% reduction in fungus in the air.

We are confident that this installation will keep our community safer during community outbreaks (Covid or otherwise).

Phones

Residents often order a phone installed (private line) in their room. The phone company needs to come in Monday through Friday between 8 am and 4 pm to have phone service activated. When the telephone company says they have provided service, their phone needs to be plugged into the cream colored phone jack on the wall. The orange jack is for data - not phone. This is often put in the wrong jack, giving the impression that the phone does not work.
